

Algorithm

The stopping of external venous bleeding by applying a pressure bandage.

1. Please treat your hands with an antiseptic and use personal protection (wear gloves) before starting work.

2. Betray the patient - on his back or sitting in a comfortable position for him. Be close so that you can see the patient's face (watch to see if you are hurting) and the entire dressing surface.

3. Betray your limbs with an elevated cushion.

4. Cover the wound with a sterile napkin, on top of which place a pressure member (non-deployed bandage).

5. Apply a circular dressing, exerting maximum pressure on the wound:

- take the free end of the bandage in your left hand, and its downloaded part in your right;

- roll the bandage around the limb from left to right (clockwise), grabbing the end of the bandage with the first two turns (rounds) and holding each round with your free left hand;

- the first two rounds of the bandage should completely cover each other in order to fix the end of the bandage well, and each subsequent turn should partially overlap the previous one, fixing it;

- the last 2 rounds of the bandage, like the first two, are superimposed on each other, then the bandage is cut along, knotted at both ends (do not break the bandage, since one of the ends can break off)

6. Evaluate the effectiveness of stopping bleeding - lack of bleeding.
