

A Standardized Patient (clinical algorithms and management)

Counseling for pregnant women

(according to the clinical protocol № 417 «Prenatal care»)

1. Greet the patient warmly and politely; confirm patient`s details (name, date of birth);
2. Find out the patient's complaints
3. Gather important information:
 - characteristics of the menstrual cycle (the length of the menstrual cycle, menstrual regularity, the date of the last menstrual period);
 - past obstetric history;
 - serious illnesses;
 - bad habits;
4. Inform the patient about a preliminary diagnosis
6. Gain verbal consent
7. Recommend necessary examinations for the patient (speculum examination, bimanual examination, blood type, Rhesus-factor, RW, HIV, HBsAg, complete blood count, urinalysis, bacteriological examination of urine, cytomorphological examination, bacterioscopic examination, ultrasound examination of the pelvic organs, biochemical screening tests (I trimester - PAPP-A, β -hCG; II trimester – alpha-fetoprotein, β -hCG, estriol), genetic specialist consultation, consultation with other specialists as needed)
